The Problem: Growing fast but drowning in chaos

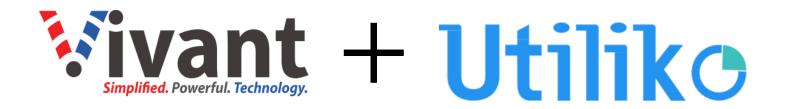

Sound familiar? Here's what Vivant was dealing with at \$1M in revenue:

Nobody Knew What Anyone Else Was Doing

- Finance: Stuck in QuickBooks with zero visibility into operations
- **HR**: Managing everything in spreadsheets
- Sales: Living in CRM or email threads that didn't talk to anyone else
- Operations: Tracking projects on paper

Vivant wasn't tracking billable hours or invoicing accurately, and the team wasted hours on duplicate entries.

Inefficiency Eating Profits

- 40% of team time wasted on manual data entry
- 3-week client onboarding due to handoff delays
